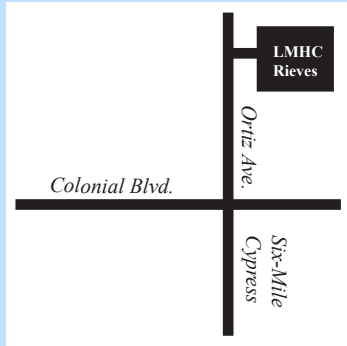

What is Rieves?

Rieves Residential is typically a 30-90 day residential treatment program serving 16 adults with severe and persistent mental illnesses as well as those with co-occurring disorders. Rieves provides services to adults at risk of psychiatric hospitalization and persons who have interfaced with the legal system and require intensive monitoring and stabilization. The program provides individuals with the stabilization and skills training necessary in order to return to a more independent and less restrictive environment within the community. Rieves is a voluntary program and persons must be willing and competent to consent to treatment.



How long does it last?

Treatment is individualized and specific to each resident. Prompt return to the community is the goal. The resident, treatment providers and others involved in treatment work together to expedite the discharge process while ensuring each resident has gained the skills necessary for a successful transition back to the community.

What can I expect?

At admission, residents are introduced to the treatment team, consisting of technicians, nurses, and clinicians. Persons spend a great deal of time with their assigned technician who provides a thorough orientation to the residence, resident group schedule, house rules, visitation hours, etc... Individuals can expect to meet with their treatment team to develop their plan of treatment. All residents are required to be involved in daily group therapy as they work toward accomplishing their treatment goals. Persons will meet with the attending physician weekly along with the entire treatment team for bi-monthly treatment planning sessions. Most treatment takes place in the group setting and all skills learned in house are practiced during outings in the community.



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What is expected of me?

Residents are expected to participate fully, or to the best of their ability, in the treatment and recovery process. Individuals are also required to respect peers and staff.



How much does it cost?

All potential residents are required to meet with a financial counselor to determine rate of pay.
